A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS pollinator species such as birds, bats, and insects are essential partners of farmers and ranchers in producing much of our food supply, and the maintenance of healthy pollinator populations is critical to the continued economic well-being of agricultural producers; and

WHEREAS pollination plays a vital role in the health of our national forests and grasslands; and

WHEREAS pollinators provide significant environmental benefits necessary for maintaining healthy, biodiverse ecosystems, and the United States Department of Agriculture assists producers in promoting wise conservation stewardship, including the protection and maintenance of pollinators and their habitats on working lands and wildlands; and

WHEREAS the Department's participation in the North American Pollinator Protection Campaign (<http://www.pollinator.org>), a public-private partnership, is an important example of cooperative conservation;

NOW, THEREFORE, in recognition of the importance of pollinator species to agriculture and to forest and grassland environments and other ecosystems, I, Thomas J. Vilsack, Secretary of the United States Department of Agriculture, do hereby proclaim June 20–26, 2011, as National Pollinator Week. I call upon the people of the United States to join me in celebrating the vital significance of pollinators with appropriate observances and activities.
