Providing New Resources for Fruit and Vegetable Producers

 Continues support for Beekeepers and prioritizes research on Colony Collapse Disorder

2007 Farm Bill:

- o Supports beekeepers by extending the honey marketing loan.
- Requires USDA to continue research to identify causes and solutions to address Colony Collapse Disorder in honey bees.

Program Basics:

- Honey prices are supported through marketing loans that provide interim financing and additional income support if market prices fall below 60 cents per pound.
- Colony collapse disorder (CCD) is characterized by the sudden dieoff of honey bee colonies. The cause of CCD has not been determined and is a cause of concern for beekeepers and farmers who rely on bees to pollinate their crops.

GRAM.—Research and extension grants may be made 6 to survey and collect data of honey bee colony pro7 duction and health; research various factors possibly 8 contributing to or associated with colony collapse 9 disorder; and develop mitigative and preventative 10 measures to improve bee health.
